Symbiosis initiated a long-term strategic partnership with Singapore Polytechnic (SP) last year in various areas such as student exchange, innovation, setting up an Advanced Manufacturing Learning Journey at SIU, commercializing design thinking projects with industry, etc. SP and SIU now collaborate on the SP global initiative program for SP and SIU students called the **Learning Express (LeX) internationalisation program**, which involves 20 of our students and two faculty members joining 20 SP students in using design thinking to uncover community challenges and insights, and identify unmet needs of grassroots communities. **This collaboration provides a unique opportunity for our students to enhance their global perspectives**, engage in meaningful community projects, and develop crucial design thinking and innovation skills.
